With Art, we Rethink and Reset for a better tomorrow

17-18 March 2022, The October Gallery Private View: 17 March, 4.30 - 8.30 PM (invitation only), 18 March, 10.00 AM - 3.00 PM (free entry)

Together is an exhibition of works from intergenerational artists that paint personal journeys and explore new potential futures. The exhibition sees works by professional, emerging and student artists exploring three key themes: environment, community and wellbeing.

Offering a unique perspective, young artists from our partner organisation **Westminster Kingsway College** respond to current political and social issues such as racism, the climate crisis and mental health. This exhibition is part of Abundant Art's larger cross-arts community regeneration project. Launched during the enforced isolation of lockdowns it provides a platform for young students to explore their creative perspectives and imaginations.

Shawn Lourdes will be presenting 'Metamorphic', a continuation to an untitled series and is a compilation of recorded audio and visual data from around London reinterpreted through using methods like sampling of sounds, field recordings, granular synthesis and AR. Shawn is a multidisciplinary artist and music producer, with a focus on audio visual work dealing with the social constructs of data and consumption in the age of.

Together will also showcase a selection of contemporary Indian paintings, prints and sculptures from **Abundant Art Gallery**'s international portfolio of artists to support this cross-arts initiative. The artists are part of 'Contrivance', an artist guild.

This collaborative exhibition presents works across visual arts, design, gifts, merchandise and live installations. *Together* explores the potential of sharing resources, building relationships and creating communities. *Together* we can enrich our future.

Protima Chatterjee, Founder and Creative Director of Abundant Art said: 'I believe art brings meaningful purpose to life and creates positive thinking, which helps people achieve in every field. Through Abundant Art, we aim to instil artistic passion and creative skills into our communities, especially the younger generation, and aid their creative development into the artists of tomorrow.
